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Summer Reading Events

Tues. June 18 3:30 PM Summer Reading Kickoff: Magician Scott Martell

Thurs. June 20 3:30 PM Solstice Program

Celebrate the longest day of the year and the beginning of summer. We will learn how to do the yoga sun salutation pose as well as listen to stories about the summer solstice, and make a flower crown. For ages 4 and up, with caregiver.

Join Ms. Abby outside to listen to picture books about birds and then make a bird feeder out of a milk carton. We will meet outside on the lawn. For ages 4 and up, with caregiver.

Tues. July 2 3:30 PM Grocery Store Gardening

Ms. Wendy will teach the basics of propagating plants from kitchen veggie scraps in this fun STEM program. Participants leave with an information sheet on what they can grow as well as some experiments to try at home! We will meet outside on the lawn. For ages 7 and up, with caregiver.

Tues. July 9 3:30 PM **Outstanding Owls**

Listen to local artist Rob Dunlavey read one of the picture books he illustrated, *Owl Sees Owl* by Laura Godwin, and learn how Rob created the drawings of the owls in the book. Then make an owl puppet. For ages 4 and up, with caregiver.

Weds. July 10 10 & 11 AM Wild World of Reptiles

Joy from Joys of Nature will bring live reptiles to Hannah Williams Playground and teach kids about these amazing animals. She will also talk about what we can all do to help these animals. For ages 4 and up, with caregiver. Event takes place at Hannah Williams Playground, 71 Main Street.

Thurs. July 11 10:30 AM Read to a Bunny

Children will listen to a rabbit-themed story, learn about rabbit behavior and interact with the bunnies. For ages 3 and up, with caregiver.

Mon. July 15 3:30 PM Learn Ukulele with Julie Stepanek

Join Julie Stepanek as she teaches the fundamentals of ukulele playing. No experience necessary. Ukuleles provided or bring your own. For ages 7 and up.

Join Ms. Abby to learn how to use recycled materials to create a speedy, rubber band powered race car. Kids will leave with their own car to race at home. For children in grades 1st-3rd, with caregiver.

Children will listen to a picture book about the Mexican artist Diego Rivera, and then we will create our own collaborative sidewalk chalk mural to represent all the many things in nature we care about.
